

# President and CEO Monthly Report to CHC Board of Directors June 27, 2022

Reporting period: May 21 – June 24, 2022

# Summary of the Issues:

- Two threats are shifting 340B resources away from health centers
  - Manufacturers refusing to honor 340B pricing at contract pharmacies (estimated lost resources for CHC = \$419,000)
  - Pharmacy Benefit Managers (PBMs) and insurance companies offering discriminatory contract terms for claims filled with 340B drugs (reimbursement reduced by as much as 36%)
- These actions are being challenged in a number of (seemingly endless) lawsuits
- Definitive and timely resolution requires Congressional action to reform the 340B statute

# Advocacy & Health Policy



# Activity this month:

- DC "fly-in" for virtual and in person meetings with members of Congress advocating for PROTECT340B
- NACHC held a national press conference, that was attended by nine major news outlets, to release "340B: A Critical Program for Community Health Centers" including survey data from 300 health centers across 48 states – CHC presented in press conference and gave follow up interviews
- In one related lawsuit the Supreme Court of the United States rendered a decision with favorable implications for health centers – CHC provided media response
- PhRMA the national trade association for drug manufacturers has invited SV to attend the July 21<sup>st</sup> meeting of their Board of Directors to share the value of 340B to health centers, explain the damage being done by manufacturer and PBM actions, and discuss consensus proposals for a resolution
- Major national advocacy campaign to generate congressional support for the PROTECT340B bill

### • Funding:

- National focus on:
  - Avoiding a "cliff" due to expiration of mandatory funding - \$4.0 billion of the programs \$5.78 billion expires at the end of FY23
  - Capital funding for the construction, expansion, and modernization of health centers – supporting \$10 billion in capital funding and \$6.3 billion in primary care workforce funding
- CHC is continuing to advocate for "earmark" to support expansion/realignment of service delivery sites in Clinton
